

Something Special For the Lady A's

SCOTCHEROOS 1 C. light corn syrup, 1 C. sugar, 1 C. peanut butter,

1 C. butterscotch chips. 1 C. chocolate chips, 6 C. Rice Krispies. Combine corn syrup and sugar in a 3-qt. saucepan. Cook & stir over medium heat until sugar dissolves & mixture begins to boil. Remove from heat & add peanut butter. Mix well and add Rice Krispies. Press into a well-greased 9X13 pan. In a 1-qt. pan, melt the chocolate chips and butterscotch chips over low heat, or microwave to melt. Mix and spread over cereal mixture. Cool, cut & serve!

<u>HAWAIIAN CHEESE BALL</u> 2-8 oz. pkgs. cream cheese - softened, 1 8 ½ oz. can crushed pineapple (drained) ¼ C. finely diced green pepper, 2 T. onion, finely minced, 1 T. seasoned salt, 1 C. finely chopped walnuts – divided. Mix softened cream cheese with pineapple, green pepper, onion, seasoned salt, and ¼ C. chopped walnuts. Roll in remaining ¾ C. walnuts. Serve at room temperature. Refrigerate any leftovers. Great with pita chips, Triscuit or other sturdy crackers.

TOFFEE SQUARES 1 C. butter or margarine, 1 C. brown sugar, 1 egg yolk, 1 t. vanilla, 2 C. flour, ¼ t. salt, 1-6 oz. package chocolate chips. Cream butter and sugar. Add egg yolk, vanilla, salt, and flour. Spread in a 9X13 greased pan. Bake at 325° for 15-20 minutes. Sprinkle chocolate chips on immediately and spread as they melt. Cool and cut into squares.

VEGETARIAN NO-ROLL MEXICAN RICE ENCHILADAS Serves 5; prep time-30 min. 1 box (6.4 oz.) rice and vermicelli mix with Spanish seasonings, 2 ¼ C. water, 2 T. butter, 1 can (19 oz.) Old El Paso mild enchilada sauce, 1 can (16 oz.) pinto beans − drained and rinsed, 1 can (11 oz.) Southwestern style corn, drained, 1 package (8.2 oz.) flour tortillas − 6 − 10" tortillas, 2 C. finely shredded Mexican cheese blend (8 oz.) Spray 9X13 pan with Pam, In 12" skillet, cook rice & vermicelli according to directions on the box. Stir in ½ C. enchilada sauce, pinto beans, and corn. Heat oven to 350°. Place ½ C. rice mixture in center of each tortilla & top w/ 1 T. cheese − fold in half. Arrange tortillas in 2 rows of 5 in pan, placing tortillas open-end up, slanting and overlapping. Pour remaining enchilada sauce evenly over all. Cover with foil. Bake for 30-35 minutes til sauce is bubbling. Uncover; sprinkle with remaining cheese. Bake uncovered for 5 minutes. Great served with a salad and refried beans.
