Member's Corner: "My First Love"

My first model A was purchased from an antique store in Shawano, Wisconsin, west of Green Bay in the early 70's. I was not looking for any car but it sat there on the store lot as we passed by. I inquired and it was a fine running car with plates on it and a title. I saw the fine condition, no rust, not restored, but all was nice. Everything worked, including a 50's style radio on the floor (option). It was painted black with brush or a home paint job, but looked fine from 5 feet away. The antique store offered me a "two-fer" sale with the other A on the lot, but I had all I could handle with one. I drove it from Shawano to Green Bay & Beloit as my friend followed me the distance in case of a breakdown. It made it that cold November day; great gas mileage, too. I had never driven one so this was a new experience for me. The first time I rode an A was my aunt's during WWII in Beloit. I was about 4 years old. My car cost about \$2000 (can't recall exactly) and made it to Beloit on bad tires. Everything worked fine on that 4 hour trip. It had seal beams with 1930 style head light shells. I bought books when I got home and didn't know there was an A club in Rockford. I found out I had an early excellent "28-AR" chassis with left hand emergency brake under an 1929 Murray 4-door sedan. The chassis had powerhouse generator, AR features, a double venturi carburator and very good running engine. It was mismatched because Ford never made a Murray 4-door on an AR chasis. But who cares ? It ran great - no problems ever. The 4 fenders were mint, maybe original paint ? I finally sold it as a separate chassis and body. I used the money to help restore my 1930 Murray 4-door you see me with now. But I wish I had that chassis back with a great engine and that double venturi carburator!


Fashion Fun - Getting Started


