

Member's Corner: "This Model A Could Fit - Mostly - in a Charcoal Bag"

When Gar Williams offered his 1930 Station Wagon project for sale, I was first in line, begging him for the opportunity to get all of its pieces out of his airplane hangar and into our garage. He said, "NO!" I think he said that because he likes Janet and he knows that we enjoy spending our time driving our Model A's. He said that it was too big a project and there was way too much work left to do ... and, it would take too much time. If Gar's "reluctance" to sell to me was a sales ploy, it worked. I badgered him until he relented and accepted our full price offer. For the ride home, "Kingsford" as we were already calling it, filled an 8.5' X 20' car trailer about four feet deep. Of course, stowing a "parts car" (as Jan calls them when they are all apart) filled our two car garage, half the basement, and all our extra closets, storage sheds, and guest rooms.

We made a separate trip to retrieve the engine and took it straight to Skokie for rebuilding. In hindsight, that was probably a bit premature. Sixteen months of sanding and varnishing, drilling and screwing, upholstering, bolting, unbolting, painting and rebolting – after Antique Engine completed the engine – we finally fired the car up for the first time. Two weeks later – this May – Jan bought the license plates and we drove Kingsford to the forest preserve to take some pictures. The next day we drove to New Glarus, WI, for lunch and a Spotted Cow. The car ran great (although it does not handle like a Roadster), but the brakes soon began pulling very hard to the left. Getting home safely required careful use of the emergency brake and a fair amount of worry on Jan's part.

Today, at about 500 miles, the Woody is far from finished, but the tasks remaining fit neatly on a single sheet of paper. We're trying to get something checked off every night because our plan is <u>TO DRIVE IT</u> to Niagara Falls for the MARC National Meet. We are praying for fair weather (no rain on our wooden car) and no roadside challenges. We absolutely do not want to borrow Paul and Elaine's rubber chicken!

Was Gar right? Was this project too big? Was it too much work? I can see his point right now ... and we are definitely going to drive this summer, not spin wrenches and varnish maple. But every time Kingsford gets another thumbs up or big smile of appreciation it makes the hard memories of frustration and impossible jobs fade and the effort seem like it was pretty easy and absolutely worthwhile. I'll wait a while for Jan to express the same happy vibe – before I look at the next "parts car"!

This Month's Tech-Tip: Flow Testing Zenith Carburetor Jets— Summary of May Tech-Talk

Re-sizing and flow testing the jets:

The four jets associated with the carburetor should be soldered closed, re-drilled, and then flow checked on a flow tester to produce a quality restoration that will perform well on the car. The flow tester can be made of a number of different materials and styles, as long as the water column is 36" high. This means that from the center of the jet to the point at the top of the column where the water spills over should be a length of 36". The water flow can be accomplished with the use of a small electrical fishpond pump obtainable at most home supply stores.

According to most Zenith carburetor literature the jets should be drilled out to the following sizes.

Main -	63 go, 62 no go
Cap - Comp -	63 go, 62 no go
Comp -	65 go, 64 no go
Idle -	75 go, 74 no go

Below is a test setup similair to the one we used at our Tech-Talk. This particular one is from Tom Endy, technical writer for MAFCA.



Main - 140-150 cc per min.

Cap - 150 - 180 cc per min.

Comp - 138 - 142 cc per min

Idle – 38 – 42 cc per min.







Fashion Fun - Era Patterns

The PATTERN PROJECT of the MARC Fashion Committee is designed to encourage Model A Car enthusiasts to "dress the part" when driving their vintage cars! The actual vintage clothes of the era are lovely to see on special occasions, but many are fragile and not wearable for a long period of time. Making garments from Era patterns gives the vintage look without the fragile feel. We now have actual copies of original patterns, printed on white durable paper, ready to be cut out and used. They are only available in the size printed on the pattern, but they are easily altered because of the style of the garments. Some dresses are designed to slip over your head and none of them require the installation of a zipper! Ladies' sizes (36, 38, etc.) indicate the bust measurement, and Misses' sizes (12, 14, etc) indicate the age. The MARC Fashion Standards book has an excellent section on reproduction sewing and fabrics with additional guides for such things as neck openings, plackets and sleeves. There is also a section on how to make alterations to patterns.



Patterns are \$28.00 for MARC Members, and \$40.00 for non-MARC members.


