In the Fall of 2007, at the Beloit Autorama, someone wanted to buy the Thunderbird, so we sold it. Having never owned a really antique car, we decided it was now or never to find one. I did know there were parts readily available for Model A's, so we decided we want a Victoria and started looking. The rest is recent history. We paid too much. We didn't buy a good enough car. We've spent way too much on it. We've put about 19,000 miles on it and have owned it longer than any other fun car. That's all due to the wonderful people we've met in our club.



This Month's Tech-Tips: Adjusting Your Brakes

After hearing several conversations about brake adjustments from our club members over past few years I offer this info on Model A brakes taken from article in our Model A News, March - April, 2010 by Jeremy Crews. Jeremy is an engineer and inventor and owned his first Model A in 1948. I spoke to him on the phone once about his article. His step by step brake article is very detailed and I passed out copies awhile back in our meeting. New members need to read this.

After correctly restoring your complete mechanical braking system, Jeremy recommends front brakes at 40% and rears at 60% braking ability. Do not set at 50-50 or 60% front brakes. More important his reason is if the front brakes are locked up you will loose your front steering ability. Fords manual also requests 40% front, 60% rear brakes. This is a safety issue for Model A's.

Jeremy's technical info: After restoring and adjusting your system, while applying brakes firmly, if your car veers to the right or left, loosen the rear slack adjuster (the large square stud inside each backing plate) one click on the side you veer toward. Then drive test again. Best to read his entire article. For restoring follow Les Andrews book with maroon cover called Model A Ford Mechanics Handbook.

I found a helpful aid is to drive a lot of stop and starts then quickly use a heat measuring device called Infrared Thermometer to see different temperatures each brake drum. Or touch each drum with one finger to see differences in heat by feel. Too hot or too cool tells you something!


Dropping & Installing the Oil Pan

During recent breakfasts and at Sharon Model A Day, engaging in conversations about dropping oil pan, I found a few members needed tips for dropping and installing their oil pan. One method use (4) 5/16 cut to 4.5" long threaded rods plus 2 nuts each in place of 4 pan bolts, (2) each side. Then remove all oil pan cap screws. Reverse operation for reinstalling pan. OR buy the Fel-Pro "snap ups" 4 in each pack which do same thing at a cheap price. It's # ES72863 (future # 21-4100) available at O'Reily's, have them order on phone for quick delivery. Make sure it's the 5/16 thread.




