
### Tech Tip -- How to Read Tire Wear


The way your tires wear is a good indicator of other parts of your car. Abnormal wear patterns are often caused by the need for simple tire maintenance, or for front end alignment. Tires should be inspected 3 ways. 1) visually examine all 4 tires; 2) feel the tread by hand to detect wear such as feathering and third, check all 4 tires with a pocket type pressure gauge. Inflate to tire manufacturer's specifications.




#### **Over Inflation**—**Excessive wear at the center of the tread**. The tire is riding on the center of the tread and wearing it premet

The tire is riding on the center of the tread and wearing it prematurely. The cure for this is to replace either the tires or the wheels.





This type of wear usually results from consistent under inflation. Tire pressure should be checked with a reliable pressure gauge. When this type of wear occurs, and the tire pressure is known to be consistently correct, a bent or worn steering component or the need for wheel alignment could be indicated. Bent steering or idler arms can effect toe-in and poor handling characteristics on turns.




**Feathering—Rounded edge on one side of the tread and a sharp edge on the other**. By running your hand over the tire, you can usually feel the sharper edges before you'll be able to see them. The most common cause of feathering is incorrect toe-in setting. It can be cured by setting it correctly. Occasionally, toe-in can be set correctly, but this wear pattern still occurs. This is usually due to deteriorated bushings in the front suspension, causing the wheel alignment to shift as the car moves down the road.



**One Side Wear—An inner or outer rib wears faster than than the rest of the tire.** Excessive camber in the front suspension causes the wheel to lean too much to the inside or outside. However, the camber isn't adjustable on the Model A. Therefore, misalignment could be due to sagging springs, worn king pins, or worn control arm bushings. Car may simply need the wheels aligned.

### Cupping—Scalloped dips around the edge of the tread on one side or the other.



Cups almost always indicate worn (sometimes bent) suspension parts. Adjustment of wheel alignment alone will seldom cure the problem. Any worn component that connects the wheel to the car (king pin, wheel bearings, springs, bushings, etc.) can cause this condition. Worn components should be replaced with new ones. Occasionally, wheels that are out of balance will wear like this, but wheel imbalance usually shows up as bald spots between the outside edges and center of the tread.




