Model A Ford Carburetors

Most Model A enthusiasts know that 'As' came from the factory with a Zenith carburetor.

- Zenith 1 by Zenith
- Zenith 2 made by Holley
- Zenith 3 made by Ford. All three were essentially the same and all were identified as a Zenith. (Cast iron bowl)

Later, Tillotson made an after-market replacement carburetor for the Model A which is a different design. (Cast aluminum) These were usually sold through Western Auto. These have retained their popularity.

Allstate: Model 2405 Borg-Warner Carter Manufacturing Company Genuine Antique Parts Johnson, Model JFA Kayce KTK Marvel Carburetor Company Western Auto Wheeler-Schebler Carburetor Company Wizard: Model L131 and L130 Marvel-Schebler Mochi MotorCraft Rayfield R-I-F Sears, Roebuck & Company Simmons

In the United States, Mother's Day started nearly 150 years ago, when Anna Jarvis, an Appalachian homemaker, organized a day to raise awareness of poor health conditions in her community, a cause she believed would be best advocated by mothers. She called it "Mother's Work Day." In 1905, her daughter, also named Anna, began a campaign to memorialize the life work of her mother. In 1914 Anna's hard work paid off when Woodrow Wilson signed a bill recognizing Mother's Day as a national holiday.Mother's Day has flourished in the United States. In fact, the second Sunday of May has become the most popular day of the year to dine out, and telephone lines record their highest traffic, as sons and daughters everywhere take advantage of this day to honor and to express appreciation of their mothers.
