Tech-Talk: Model A Ford Service Bulletins

Model SERVICE BULLETINS

FORD

I highly recommend the important book MODEL A SERVICE BULLETINS---complete. Available thru the big vendors and its a little pricey but worth every penny @ \$36.95 new. Official design changes 1928-31. This book ends all the "stuck on stupid" stuff like putting only 600 W in our steering gear not grease. I bought my book years ago, Invaluable!

The MAFCA site says: "When the Model A was new, FoMoCo sent monthly service bulletins to their dealers' mechanical staff to inform them on service routines, changes in parts, service tips, etc. A complete set of these are very rare. In 1957, Dan Post published a 5"x8" soft back version of the Service Bulletins (gray cover). This was followed by a hardback version (yellow cover, 320 pages) about 1972 that's still being sold today. Library of Congress Catalog Card Number 72-90821. ISBN 911160-28-0 About 1974, the service bulletins were reproduced almost exactly, even down to the dark blue covers, string binding, and original sized shiny paper by Ben Staub, Dayton Carrier Company of Dayton Ohio, who also sold Model A Trunks. This reproduction has grown to be VERY valuable recently."

Fashion Fun: Those Sensational Capes

The predecessor of the cape, the cloak, appeared well before the twentieth century. The cloak was a functional garment, meant to keep the wearer safe from virtually any kind of weather. At night it doubled as a blanket for protection from the elements. By the Model A era, the cloak was elegantly transformed into the cape. No longer was it simply functional. It adorned both dresses and coats, or was a garment on its own. Here we are showcasing capes in their role as an outer garment.
